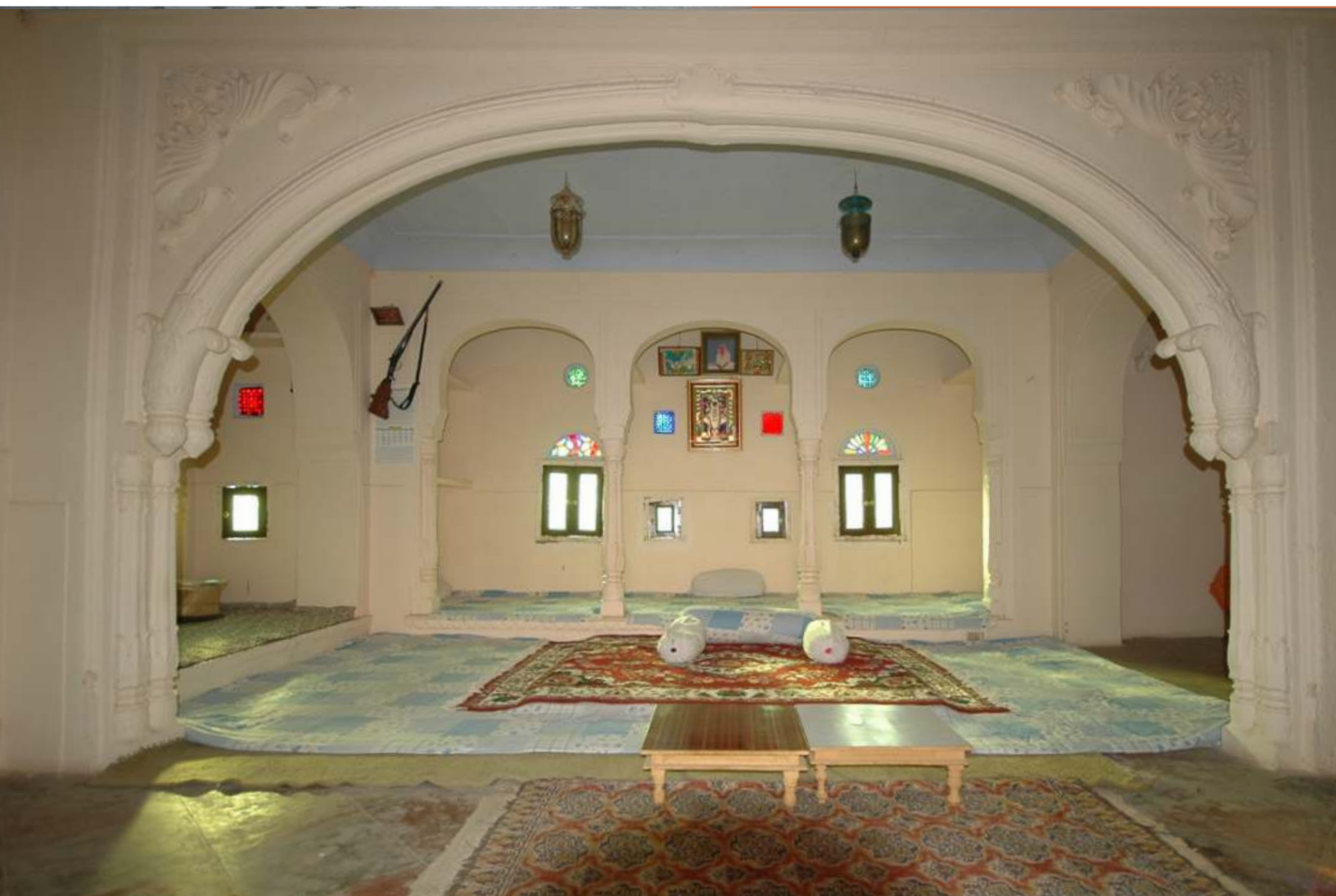

Lotwara is located amidst green plains of Rajasthan in the Dausa district. The land of beautiful peacocks, Lotwara is a soothing treat for eyes and has a unique blend of history, and mythology. The place is located on the banks of the famous sacred river, Banganga. The simplicity of the rural life of farmers, cattle-rearers, potters and carpenters will captivate you with its blend of tradition, hard work and artistic beauty. Trek around the village and be witness to some of the best sunrises and sunsets.

What to look around for?

Enjoy walking through the cascading fields of wheat, barley and mustard, and take a glimpse of the perfect rural picture. One of the largest Baoris (step well), Abhaneri, is located just 7 km from Lotwara and should not be missed. Indulge in camel safaris and camping at picturesque locations in Lotwara. The festivals are celebrated here with traditional style and rituals.

What not to miss?

Lotwara is located on the banks of the Banganga river, which is believed to have been dug out by the striking of an arrow by Arjuna to quench the thirst of Bhishma Pitamah in the epic of Mahabharat. The 17th century marvel, the Fort of Lotwara, is also one of the highlights of the Village and was built by the then Maharaja.

Where to stay?

You can opt for

- Nearby Heritage Hotel
- Camping at designated camping sites

How can I get there?

Lotwara is 10 km off Jaipur - Agra National Highway from Sikandara (90 km from Jaipur).

How far is the closest city (with accommodation facility)?

- Dausa (District Headquarter) - 35 km
- Alwar - 65 km
- Jaipur (nearest airport) - 100 km
